High Impact Live Fire Training Weekend

This is a 2 day 16 hour course that address:

- Session 1 – Flashover Survival
- Session 2 – Firefighter Survival
- Session 3 – Engine Co Operations
- Session 4 – Primary Search

Each session consists of 25 firefighters in 4-hour segments.

Course Descriptions:

Flashover Survival: Learning the signs of **FLASHOVER** will allow you to make better fireground decisions. This course will provide an understanding of **FLASHOVER**. The practical evolutions will provide the opportunity to safely experience **FLASHOVER** under controlled conditions.

Firefighter Survival – This course is designed for self-rescue and rescue of trapped firefighters. This course will enable firefighters to recognize the types of events encountered on the fire ground that contribute to firefighter disorientation and/or entrapment, to have knowledge of what is necessary to ensure their safety and that of their partners or crew members, and perform self-rescue techniques when disoriented, separated, or when needing to exit a structure in an emergency..

Engine Co Operations – Engine company skills are required and used at almost every alarm. Engine company skills are the basis for everything we do during fire suppression operations. Effective and efficient hose line deployment is often the critical factor that determines if building occupants and firefighters are rescued or injured or killed by fire. Firefighters conducting searches depend on the ability of the engine company to control the fire.

This course is designed to improve your skills as a member of the Engine Company attack team: Officer, nozzleman, backup man and doorman. Training objectives include: how to stretch hose lines efficiently, specific and critical responsibilities of members of the attack team and use of the attack team concept by volunteer fire departments.

Primary Search: Of all the facets of firefighting, **SEARCH AND RESCUE** may be the most important task the firefighter performs. Due to the critical nature of **Search and Rescue**, and because it is such a demanding task, both physically and mentally, firefighters must practice the techniques frequently. This course will benefit the new firefighter and the veteran equally. Topics discussed include self-contained breathing apparatus, ventilation, backdraft, and flashover.

These training programs involve evolutions under live fire conditions. During these evolutions we provide realistic training under controlled conditions. All students who participate in these evolutions shall be medically evaluated as specified by OSHA and NFPA requirements. It is the responsibility of each fire department to provide this medical evaluation for their firefighters. Each student is responsible for notifying the Instructor if they have any condition which might affect their ability to participate in any evolution.

Certification – A certificate of completion will be issued upon receipt of payment and completion of all course sessions.

Dress – Dress is casual, however **FULL OSHA COMPLIANT FIREFIGHTING PROTECTIVE CLOTHING, INCLUDING SCBA, IS REQUIRED TO PARTICIPATE!** For **Flashover class:** Students must wear long pants, and long sleeve shirts (sweatshirts and sweatpants or jeans are recommended) under their turnout gear.

Additional requirements: In accordance with **OSHA regulations and NFPA standards, no facial hair allowed! (Mustache's are OK)**
